Splinting, using either custom or prefabricated orthoses, is a key component of the upper limb management.

This seminar explores the principles behind splint selection and application to protect healing structures, maintain alignment, prevent deformity and support functional recovery.

- Understand the biomechanical principles of wrist and hand splinting.
